Yes – the remains of the moat are visible as earthworks in the grassed open space here. They are also shown on lidar data (viewed as side by side on the National Library of Scotland website).

### **Please describe the site. Include its possible date, and whether it survives (for example) as building remains, earthworks or archaeological deposits.**

Moated sites are medieval. Ashmore Park was one of the estates that Lady Wulfrun gave to the church at Wolverhampton in 994AD. There was probably a farmhouse here built in the 13<sup>th</sup> century, surrounded by the moat. Moat survives as earthworks.

The moat is also shown on historic mapping, such as the Wednesfield Tithe map.

### **Is it possible to visit the site without special permission, or see it from a public highway?**

Yes – the moat is visible in the grassed open space outside the shops on Griffiths Drive.
